1. Engage in the ministry of “flash prayers” this week. As you see others, silently offer quick prayers of blessing for them. Though you do not know their struggles, pray for God’s strength in their lives.
2. Do your Bible reading aloud this week. Savor the words. Which words stand out for you? Keep these words with you all day.
3. Practice one of these habits this week: (1) not exaggerating, (2) not gossiping or (3) not rationalizing.

CONCHO VALLEY TURNING POINT

In John 5:6: Jesus encountered a man lame from birth and asked, “Are you willing to be healed?” Strange question. For most of us, the answer is simple; a short drive to the doctor, then the pharmacy, a brief rest and we are healed. So, what does “willingness” have to do with healing? Willingness is the desire, the longing, the hungering to be whole and is born of the stark reality that without healing, death is imminent – but willingness also implies responsibility to abandon the disease we know so well and begin life as a healed person. Research indicates that in the case of infant development, severe neglect of stimulation and nurturance can result in the infant failing to thrive and even infant death. In many of our recovery groups, there are people who are willing to be healed, but like the newborn infant, may fail to thrive because there is no one to encourage and befriend them.
