KID'S EAT 2011

Here's a recap of the final statistics for our 13 public meal sites plus 2 City recreation centers:

- Nearly 23,000 meals (including seconds) were served to children;
- Over 3,000 meals were served to volunteers;
- Nearly 4,000 meals were served to parents/caregivers;
- Over 30,000 total meals were served; Over 1000 take home bags were distributed. Our average cost per meal was \$1.14 - what wonderful stewardship of the gifts received!

As a result of the *Share Our Strength - No Kid Hungry* grant, the labor of our VISTA interns, and support from Rust Street Ministries, Johnson Street Church of Christ, Fort Concho Historic Landmark, the City of San Angelo, Fort Concho Elementary School, Cornerstone Builders, Concho Valley Master Gardeners, People/Plant Connection, Don Walter Water Systems, and several individuals, our pilot neighborhood garden at Fort Concho is a reality. Located behind the Fort hospital, the garden currently has 10 8'X8' raised bed plots, with drip irrigation - planted and tended by 6 families and 4 school groups - with room for 5 additional plots in the future. We hope this garden is the first of many to come in neighborhoods throughout the county.

CHRISTIAN RELIEF FUND

Do you remember a couple of times over the last year or so when our 4th and 5th grade girls sold pillowcases they had sewn to raise money to buy a milk goat for poor families in Africa? Their effort was realized through the work of the Christian Relief Fund, an organization based in Amarillo and sponsored by Churches of Christ. Milt Jones, CRF president, will be here tonight at 6 PM, to tell us more about Christian Relief Fund, their mission and involvement around the world. CRF also sponsors the orphanage in Kitale, Kenya, East Africa, where Jennifer Ashlock is now working. I often hear someone say they would like to sponsor a child, but don't know which organization to use, CRF may be your answer. See you tonight, I know you will be blessed.

- 150 Bibles distributed
 - Over 100 hours of direct teaching/10 from JSCC members
 - 500 Bible correspondence lessons turned in and graded
 - 20 new students
 - 15 certificates of completion
- Prayer groups meeting daily

This report is typical of the efforts going on in this very active ministry at Tom Green County Jail. God is alive and making an impact on numerous lives daily.

Four JSCC members each give about 6 hours per month to this ministry. Most have been involved for years and know that they are truly sharing God to a population who knows that the world is not the answer.
