How do we cultivate community within the body of believers?

Love

JOH 13:34 "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another.

JOH 13:35 "By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

JOH 15:12 "This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you.

JOH 15:17 "This I command you, that you love one another.

ROM 13:8 Owe nothing to anyone except to love one another; for he who loves his neighbor has fulfilled {the} law.

1TH 3:12 and may the Lord cause you to increase and abound in love for one another, and for all men, just as we also {do} for you;

1TH 4:9 Now as to the love of the brethren, you have no need for {anyone} to write to you, for you yourselves are taught by God to love one another;

2TH 1:3 We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brethren, as is {only} fitting, because your faith is greatly enlarged, and the love of each one of you toward one another grows {ever} greater;

Encourage and Comfort

1TH 4:18 Therefore comfort one another with these words.

1TH 5:11 Therefore encourage one another, and build up one another, just as you also are doing.

HEB 3:13 But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is {still} called "Today," lest any one of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

HEB 10:24 and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds, HEB 10:25 not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging {one another}; and all the more, as you see the day drawing near.

Teaching, Speaking and Admonishing

ROM 15:14 And concerning you, my brethren, I myself also am convinced that you yourselves are full of goodness, filled with all knowledge, and able also to admonish one another.

EPH 5:19 speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody with your heart to the Lord;

COL 3:16 Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms {and} hymns {and} spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

Greeting

ROM 16:16 Greet one another with a holy kiss. All the churches of Christ greet you. 1CO 16:20 All the brethren greet you. Greet one another with a holy kiss.

2CO 13:12 Greet one another with a holy kiss.

1PE 5:14 Greet one another with a kiss of love. Peace be to you all who are in Christ.

Unity, Servant Attitude, Humility

MAR 9:50 "Salt is good; but if the salt becomes unsalty, with what will you make it salty {again}? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another."

1CO 6:7 Actually, then, it is already a defeat for you, that you have lawsuits with one another. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be defrauded?

ROM 12:10 Be devoted to one another in brotherly love; give preference to one another in honor;

ROM 12:16 Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation.

ROM 14:13 Therefore let us not judge one another anymore, but rather determine this-not to put an obstacle or a stumbling block in a brother's way.

ROM 14:19 So then let us pursue the things which make for peace and the building up of one another.

ROM 15:5 Now may the God who gives perseverance and encouragement grant you to be of the same mind with one another according to Christ Jesus;

ROM 15:7 Wherefore, accept one another, just as Christ also accepted us to the glory of God.

1CO 11:33 So then, my brethren, when you come together to eat, wait for one another. 1CO 12:24But God has {so}composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that {member} which lacked,

1CO 12:25 that there should be no division in the body, but {that} the members should have the same care for one another.

GAL 5:13 For you were called to freedom, brethren; only {do} not {turn} your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another.

GAL 5:15 But if you bite and devour one another, take care lest you be consumed by one another.

GAL 5:26 Let us not become boastful, challenging one another, envying one another. EPH 4:2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing forbearance to one another in love, EPH 4:32 And be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you.

EPH 5:21 and be subject to one another in the fear of Christ.

PHI 2:3 Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than himself;

COL 3:13 bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you.

EPH 4:25 Therefore, laying aside falsehood, \speak truth, each one\ {of you,} \with his neighbor, \ for we are members of one another.

COL 3:9 Do not lie to one another, since you laid aside the old self with its {evil} practices,

JAM 4:11 Do not speak against one another, brethren. He who speaks against a brother, or judges his brother, speaks against the law, and judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law, but a judge {of it.}

JAM 5:9 Do not complain, brethren, against one another, that you yourselves may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing right at the door.

Confession of Sin and Prayer

JAM 5:16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much.

Marriage Relationship

1CO 7:5 Stop depriving one another, except by agreement for a time that you may devote yourselves to prayer, and come together again lest Satan tempt you because of your lack of self-control.
